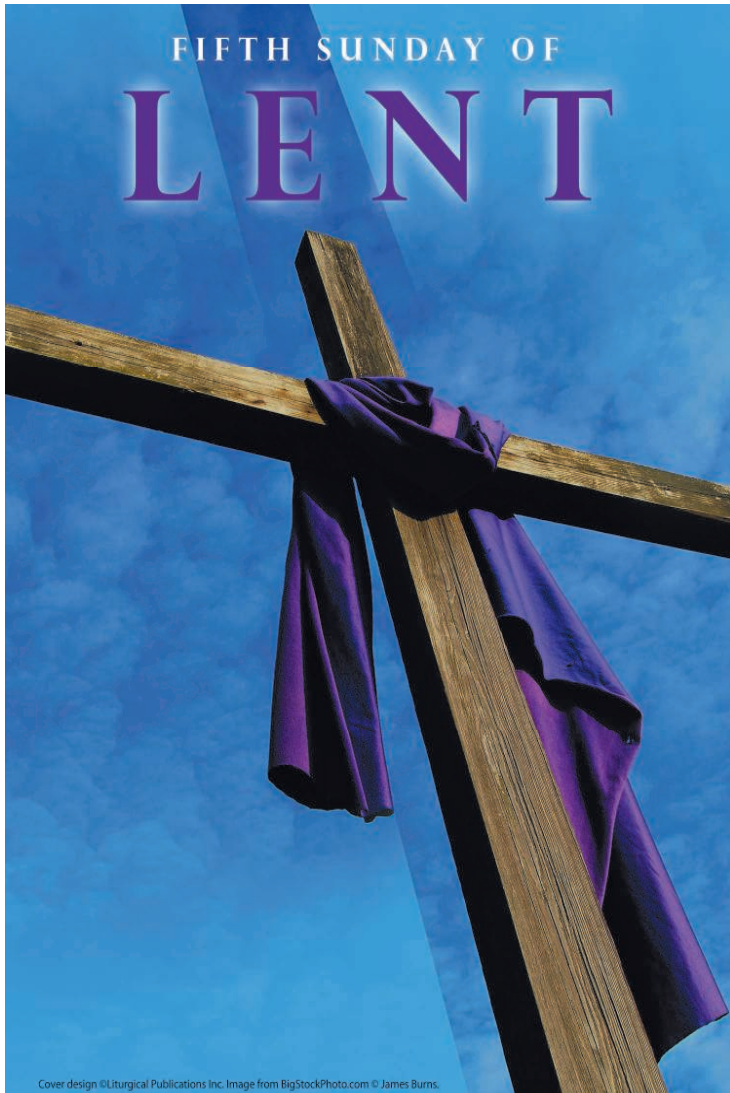

## WE ARE INVITED!



Almost all of us have received one or more invitations in our lives. Invitations come in different sizes, different shapes, and for different occasions. There are invitations for birthday parties, for bridal showers, for twenty-fifth wedding anniversaries, for dinner parties, for graduation ceremonies, and for any kind of party. There are even electronic invitations with dancing animals, talking heads, and singing choirs that come via our e-mail. The purpose of an invitation is to gather a group of people together to celebrate life by remembering a specific occurrence in life. Life which has already occurred, like a twenty fifth wedding anniversary, or life that will occur, like a baby shower. And as we all know, we can either accept an invitation or we can refuse an invitation.

Today's gospel story is an invitation which we may want to refuse but which we have to accept. Jesus gives us the invitation when he says, "Lazarus, come out!" Out of his love, Jesus calls Lazarus out of the tomb to continue the friendship that he had with Jesus before his death. Most of us probably think that Lazarus was overjoyed to be restored back to life by Jesus. But in his play called "Calvary," William Butler Yeats offers us a different point of view.

After being freed from the burial cloths that bound him, an annoyed and ungrateful Lazarus is portrayed as complaining to Jesus. "For four whole days I had been dead and I was lying still in an old comfortable cave when you came ... and dragged me back into the light." To say the least, Lazarus did not want to be raised from the dead. Life was too much for him. He wanted to withdraw to the peace of living life no more. But Jesus would have none of this for Lazarus. Nor will Jesus give us the opportunity to withdraw from life with all its conflicts.

Conflict is a healthy but not an easy part of life. It's through conflict that change emerges. Through conflict we discover our essential concerns and values. We learn about ourselves and others as well as learning about how people and things function. Conflict gives us the opportunity to go deeper into the heart of our life and our humanity. So the aim is not to remove conflict from our lives and at the same time not to go about seeking conflict. I think we would all agree that conflict doesn't have much trouble finding us.

The life of Jesus was a life of conflict and he didn't try to avoid it. He embraced the opportunity of seeking a social and religious revolution in the face of Roman occupation and social upheaval. Jesus lived in a world where there was heavy taxation, loss of land, movement to cities, and the ever-present and hostile Roman legions that had the support of some religious authorities. Jesus was one man, with a small band of followers, taking on an empire and a well-established traditional religious culture. A person could not have experienced more conflict in a short life than Jesus did. It was because of what he stood for, a radical social equality and power to the poorest, that Jesus gave his life.

Part of this unsteady social-religious environment included a conflict between what happens after death. The Sadducees believed that nothing happens. When you are dead you are dead. The only thing that survives is what you leave behind in the number of children, owned property, and memories. The Pharisees, most of the people at the time, as well as Mary, Martha, and Lazarus believed in the general resurrection. The general resurrection was when a deceased person was restored to the condition of the present life at the end of time. What we might call "future resuscitation". No wonder, Lazarus would want to stay dead in a cave.

But Jesus brings to our world a new understanding of the resurrection. "I am the resurrection and the life; whoever believes in me, even if they die, will live, and everyone who believes in me will never die." By these words Jesus not only tells the world that we not only receive a new and permanent form of life upon our death but that God is with us in this life when conflict is all around us and perhaps choking us to death.

I don't know about you, but I need faith in a resurrection that will strengthen me each day and give me hope in the present conflicts of life. I need faith in a resurrection that gives me courage to witness for what is right and to work for the coming of God's reign of peace in a world filled with terrorism and civil war. I need a God who walks with me through each challenge and every sorrow, every lonely valley and every high mountain. I need a living savior who will meet me each day, as if for the first time, with the gift of his spirit and the presence of his grace.


